Gratitude for the Gift of Grace

Almerinda taught me about sacrificial Christian love. Almerinda was my host mother when I was in Brazil as a Rotary Exchange student. Her husband spent the first 3 and ¹/₂ months I was living in their house working in Portugal. During this time, she was temporarily a single mother of 4 girls: one who had cerebral palsy and was non-verbal and bed-ridden at home, a 16-year old, an 8-year old, and me (a foreigner with limited knowledge of Portuguese). During this time, about three months after I arrived, I became very ill. She cared for me as any mother would do. After several days, she noticed the yellow skin and yellow in my eyes and knowing what it was she called a doctor to the home. The next thing I knew, I was in the hospital in a foreign country. I was diagnosed with hepatitis and ended up staying in the hospital for several days.

Thirty years ago Brazilian hospitals in medium-sized towns were nowhere near as advanced as today. I was 16, barely spoke the language, could not eat, had lost 20 pounds in one week, and was very weak and very scared. Almerinda never left my side. Even through the night, she stayed in the other bed in the hospital room. She spent all this time with me, even though there was a chance she could have spread the disease to her daughters at home. She made me laugh and worked hard at making sure I was getting the care I needed. She blessed and changed my life.

Almerinda showed me an example of what radical hospitality and Christian love was like. All I could do was to thank her personally and publically. The only way I knew I could ever truly thank her was to share that same deep hospitality and Christian love with others.

This experience reminds me of what God does for each one of us. God loves us no matter what condition we are, no matter how weak we are. God cares for us and never leaves our side. God sustains us, lifts our spirits, and gives us new life. In sum, God blesses us and changes our lives for good.

What can we do to thank God? We can thank God privately in our prayers, and publically at worship and by sharing what God's love means to us with others. We can also thank God by reaching out to others with Christian love, and we do this through our financial offerings and gifts of time and talents. God has blessed you with amazing gifts of grace – God's grace surrounds you daily. Give thanks always and in all ways.

The fencing contractor started working on the fence today. It has been a long wait for the children as we weren't supposed to allow the children to use the area without a fence. They watched the area built with great joy and anticipation and then had to wait a very long time to use it. We have let them play some in the area with very careful supervision. They have enjoyed finding the trolls who live under the bridge and tried to stay away from the alligators in the swamp. They've caught the fish that jump out of the water around the ark and played telephone through the tunnel under the slide. As you can tell, they have very vivid imaginations. As more activities are added, their creativity will no doubt expand!

Soon we will install the walking paths and then work on planting new grass seed in the remaining areas. There is still much work to be done. We have had many parents volunteer to assist us in further developing the area to include all of the areas to make this a wonderful area for families to enjoy. The school-age children will be here for two weeks in October for the first time due to the new, balanced calendar which most school systems are using. They will be making many different landscaping decorations during this time. We need your help through donations. Ladies, this is the perfect opportunity to donate all of your unused costume jewelry - pins, earrings, necklaces would all be appreciated. They will be making mosaic flower containers and decorating stepping stones. If you have any clay gardening pots, we'll take those too! They make wonderful birdbaths when stacked in an unusual way. It is rather challenging due to the fact our daycare has grown quickly in the last two months and our new staff must be thoroughly trained. We look forward to checking off this goal and moving on to Level II by Spring of 2013.

Pastor Michelle Elfers reported on her very busy August month which involved meetings with the various church committees, prayer group, Sunday School, University of Indianapolis Student Fair, as well as helping with the United Way's Day of Caring for the Daycare, coordinating a Chin congregation to meet at Bethany on a continuing basis, and following through with ordering furniture for the Nancy Costelow Memorial project.

The Treasurers reported on the flow of finances during the long 3 paycheck month of August. The need for continuing repairs on the HVAC for the entire building was discussed. A possible long term solution was discussed and will be investigated by the Finance committee. Church council members need to turn in committee budgets to Finance committee before the end of September. Shingles for the replacement roof shingles have been ordered; the insurance funded work will be scheduled soon.

Debbie Rohrman reported that the August 24-25 Days of Caring by the United Way was a tremendous success and expressed many thanks to all who helped with generous donations of snacks, cookies and especially water. Publicity from Channel 59, Channel 8 and the *Southsider Voice* has been invaluable as the fall enrollment campaign has been very successful. The fence placement is yet to be done by United Way. Many parents have volunteered to assist on an October workday on the playscape.

Worship and Music Committee members have formulated a Bethany Wedding Policy and will have that available when finalized. Earleen Ashbrook, Stewardship Chairperson, has scheduled four dates for the Stewardship campaign: Sept. 30, Oct. 7, Oct. 14, and Oct. 21. Letters to congregation members will be sent out beginning Sept. 24.

Pastor, Christian Ed. and Youth Committees and the Daycare are looking at having a combined activity with Daycare school-age youth and the youth at Bethany.

A list of the Bethany cleaning chores done by Lisa Nichols will be posted. Substitute cleaning person(s) for Lisa while she is on vacation the weekend of September 21 - 23, is still needed.

Nominations for elections at the congregational meeting on November 18 for upcoming open positions on Council were discussed.

As we experience our Lord Jesus and the Gospel there is grace. God's caring, redeeming, supporting, renewing, inspiring favor comes to us. This grace comes in the

midst of a broken world and broken lives. It takes on rebellion, hurt, illness and loss. This grace is abundant and surprising and can overwhelm our own mortal perspectives that too often see only scarcity, challenge and hopelessness.

This grace can come to us in surprising ways. It can come through the caring outreach of a trusted friend who calls or stops by just when we need them. It can come as we reach out to someone in need and find God's grace welling up in us that we might be God's grace to someone else. It can come in the simplest of things as a surprise gift, a sunny day, or the smile of a stranger.

Yet, grace can also come to us in trusted and reliable ways. Word and Sacrament are the trusted and promised sources of God's grace. In the word we find Jesus, for as Martin Luther said, the Bible is like the manger that held the Christ child. In the sacraments - in, with and under these earthly elements - we are graced with the forgiveness, life and salvation that are ours in Christ Jesus.

From September 30 through October 14, we will explore through three Scripture passages what it can mean to live in, with and under God's grace. This approach to life is at the essence of stewardship.
